Master's of Public Health (MPH) –
Health Promotion Concentration



With its **first cohort beginning fall 2018**, NAU introduces its new Master's of Public Health/Health Promotion graduate program.

This two-year program (including summer) awards a Master's of Public Health (MPH) and prepares students for careers in public health and health promotion.

The Master's of Public Health/Health Promotion program includes a rigorous course plan with classes in public health, nutrition, rural and indigenous health, physical activity promotion, and health disparities. Graduate students complete a master's-level public health project, and internship hours in public health settings across Northern Arizona.

Eligible applicants for the MPH program need a bachelor's degree and an undergraduate-level basic/intro statistics course.

Master's of Public Health/Health Promotion application ranking includes undergraduate GPA, GRE, TOEFL (international students only), and written application materials.
